Four Stakeholder Groups and Key Questions

- Buy-side content consumers
 - What ESG content do your people need to find?
 - What differentiates between signal and noise?
- Sell-side content producers
 - What parts of your process require tagging a research report for ESG?
 - What ESG content are you producing now? Next?
 - How do you want consumers to find your content?
- Content aggregators
 - What types of ESG content is getting distributed to your portals?
 - What ESG-related search terms are most common?
- Vendors creating tools
 - What ESG-related tags would help ingest the right content (text, data) into your tools?

Types of ESG Publications

- ESG "thought piece" thematic, typically authored by an ESG strategy team
- Fundamental company reports with ESG components, including weightings and/or scores
- How do ESG issues impact coverage/portfolio companies?

Key Takeaways

- Increasing interest in ESG content, data, and tools, including componentized tear sheets and cheat sheets/explanation guides for ESG concepts and terminology
- When it comes to adopting standards (e.g., SASB, ISSB), many firms are taking a "wait and see" approach
- Sell-side producers are creating in-house taxonomies
- Signal vs. noise is the overwhelming problem to solve for: what is substantive vs. passing mention, and how to treat it
- At what point is critical mass reached = client wants to see the content?
- Regional differences in degree of ESG focus and specific areas of ESG focus

Key Observations to Guide Next Steps

- Any RIXML ESG taxonomy must have a tree/rollup structure, with separate tags under E, S, and G at a minimum
- Some clients want everything, others want only content on specific areas

Other Topics Under Discussion

- Which standard should form the basis of the RIXML ESG taxonomy?
- Context-level tagging should ESG tagging in RIXML 3.0 include "context" tags for certain sections of a report?
- Al-assisted tagging, including weightings/confidence factors (e.g., "this report is about governance, with a confidence level of 6")
